

## Storage

The Club has storage facilities in the harbour area, for Club rescue boats, tender outboards, and dinghy masts, foils and up to two sails per member. There is storage for inflatable tenders for which application should be made to the Boat Storage Convenor. Dinghy parking, on the harbour wall and on the esplanade in front of the Scottish Seabird Centre, is administered by the North Berwick Harbour Trust Association (NBHTA) on behalf of East Lothian Council and contact should be made through the Harbour Master. **ELYC accepts no liability for damage to, or loss of any equipment on ELYC premises or the dinghy park**



## Club Duties

The Club runs an extensive and very successful race and social sailing programme backed up by the clubroom facilities of bar and catering. For this to be a success it is a requirement that Club members assist with different duties. If all members participate the number of duties will be minimal.

The club is now using the online 'DutyMan' system to allocate and manage duties. If you need to amend your duties, it is your responsibility to find a replacement.

Please inform a Committee Member if you are willing to do duties but have been missed off the rota. We will ensure you are included in the future and would welcome your help for special events. If racing is cancelled due to the weather, the members scheduled for duty that day will be added to the reserve list for future dates.

## Bar & Bar Duties

To comply with the Licensing (Scotland) Act 2005 all members staffing the bar must have received appropriate training and a training record kept. Bar duties will only be allocated to these trained members. They will help staff the bar during Social Functions and for the use of club members at advertised opening times. During regattas and social functions there will be a need for a rota of trained volunteers to help and these will be drawn up as necessary.

## The Club, Facilities & Duties

### The Clubhouse

East Lothian Yacht Club is situated in a picturesque old granary, overlooking North Berwick Harbour, purchased outright by the club in 1997. Reopened, following a major renovation in 2003, our facilities are greatly admired. From the entrance there is access to 'Ladies', 'Gents' and 'Disabled' toilets and changing rooms on the lower ground floor. The main clubroom and bar are on the upper ground floor. Above, on the first floor, is a large modern kitchen linked to a multi-purpose well-equipped room which can be used for training, meetings, catering for events and generally for members to relax in. There is also a small office for Race Officials and an additional toilet on the first floor. There is a door entry system, using a key fob, and members are required to obtain a key fob by means of a refundable deposit of £5. The PIN pad will remain for use at open events only, when an event specific code will be issued to visitors.



### Training Area

We have two main shore-based training areas:

- A 'wet' training area with shower and toilet area has been provided in our Rescue Boat store where trainees etc. can be briefed without changing out of sailing clothing.
- The sail loft is also used as an onshore training area but trainees are expected to be dressed in non-sailing kit.
